Description and Use

Rust Remover is a white crystalline powder designed for removing iron stains from clothing. It can also be used to remove industrial fall out from hard surfaces such as cars.

Features and Benefits

Rust stains are very difficult to remove from clothing. Rust Remover quickly removes any rust stains leaving no trace of the stain.

Rust Remover also removes industrial fall out from car surfaces. The fall out can leave a gritty feel on the paintwork which Rust Remover dissolves the deposits leaving the paint smooth.

How to Use

To remove rust stains from a piece of clothing soak in a plastic bucket using a 1% solution in water. Leave for 1 hour to act, then rinse with clean water and launder in the normal manner.

If there is only a small area of rust staining place item in a plastic bucket and cover with about 1cm of water. Sprinkle about a teaspoon of Rust Remover over the stain and leave for a few minutes. Then agitate and rinse to remove the Rust Remover. Always wear rubber gloves when handling Rust Remover.

Do not use Rust Remover in domestic washing machines or sinks or baths that have an enamel surface as the product will attack the enamel.

In a commercial laundry use at rate of 30 - 60g per 5kg linen washing at low level for 10 - 15 minutes at 70° C. Then rinse 3 times using high level to remove all residues.

To remove industrial fallout from cars make up a solution using ¼ cup in 5 litres water. Sponge solution over the car, and then rinse thoroughly with plenty of water. Ensure you are wearing rubber gloves.

Technical Data

Rust Remover is an acidic powder based on oxalic acid. It has a pH of <1 at 1% dilution.
